The look of the midsummer pole



can vary depending on the area you are in. You join hands and dance around the pole, singing songs about frogs (then jump like frogs), pretend to do different chores, like washing, and act like a crow related to a priest (don't ask, it's complicated).

The musicians are dressed in traditional clothes and play the violin and accordion. The same traditional clothes are also worn by some of the people celebrating, but not so often anymore.





All the dancing has now made us hungry so we are have coffee and a sponge cake filled with jam, custard and covered with whipped cream and strawberries. Those are the 3 traditional elements that makes up midsummer, but not everybody does all of them, even if we like to believe so.

another plot, or try to get something like this in the rainforest to save the Orang-utans.


More Midsummer Magic
