The Easter Bonnet

A Brief History and Update on the Traditional Fashion Piece

The Easter tradition of dressing up in new clothing is an English tradition that dates back to at least

Shakespearean times. As we can see in *Romeo and Juliet* in a retort from Mercutio to Benvitio, "Did thou fall out with a tailor for wearing his new doublet before Easter?" (in other words, you must have really annoyed your tailor to look so awful!) I about fell out of my chair when I read this in my research of the Easter Bonnet. I'm not sure I ever noticed that before.

During the Christian Lenten season, most wear drab coloured clothes as an outward sign of the "abstinence and humility" of the inward soul. THEN, comes Easter after 40 days of this season. As Easter is symbolic of a transformation and new life, people would begin to wear colourful outfits as an outward sign of this. Fresh flowers would be placed on hats to create a "new creation" or new hats would be bought and worn (as well as clothing).

In the States, this tradition gained popularity after the Civil War in the 1870/s, when women were ready to don more cheery clothes and accessories in exchange for the mourning colours of black and grey they had worn during the War. In 1933, Irving Berlin popularised the Easter bonnet in American Culture through writing a song ,"Easter Parade", a song inspired by the New York's Easter pilgrimage from St. Patrick's Cathedral to 5th Avenue. In the movie, by the same name of the song, Judy Garland sings the song to Fred Astaire. This movie caused this tradition to reach its peak in 1948. To this date, the 130 year traditional parade still happens in New York City, though not near as popular as it once was. On Easter, 49th



St - 57th St are closed for transport while approximately 33,000 people show up for the un organised "parade", donning their outlandish, whimsical, themed hats.

As a side note, I would like to tell you about the Broadway Cares/Equity Fights Aids Annual Easter Bonnet Competition. This started in 1987 and still is one of the biggest fundraisers the organisation has. Fifty-two theatrical productions participate beginning 6 weeks before the competition. They have donation buckets at their shows. Then, it all culminates with a production number by each troupe and they present their "Easter Bonnet" for competition.
