

Halloween Lanterns

Hello sweet friends! October is here and we are making preparations for Halloween. We love Halloween here in our house. Bamboo and me love to make lanterns. We can use them for all kinds of Light Festivals, like Christmas, Diwali and St. Maarten. Today we will show you how to make two types of easy lanterns for Halloween. But you can customise it for other Light Festivals too. Which make me wonder? What Light Festival do you celebrate?

Needed supplies



* Orange and black paper * Electric light * A jar * Glue and adhesive tape * Scissors * String * Pencil * Everything you like to spruce up your lantern (like glitter and washi tape) * Your imagination

Bamboo's safety tip!

Always use a light that is battery powered. That is much safer than using a real candle.

Lantern with a jar 1 Take orange paper and fold it around a jar, use a little adhesive or washi tape to close the ends 2 Draw a pumpkin face on it and cut it out with your scissors 3 Stick the paper to the jar with tape or glue. You can also just slide it around it, so you can use the jar with different lantern faces 4 Drop the light in the jar and... you have a lantern!

Lantern without a jar

1 Take orange or black paper

2 Fold it in threes at the short end of the paper, fold back, fold again

over the long sides of the paper, make the sides touch in the middle and fold back

3 Cut into the sides of the small thirds, but not all the way through, we need the

middle part as the bottom of the lantern

4 Draw something on the side and cut it out. Like ghoulish eyes, a bat, a scary face, stars or whatever

5 Put glue on the middle flaps and put the sides up, so you have a paper box

6 Drop in the light and... you have a lantern!



Cookie's Trick or Treat tip!

Put a string and/or a stick to the paper lantern so you can take it with you while Trick or Treating.



8) Don't use epoxy resin glue to secure your mask! Your humans won't let you hear the end of it, and you will have to take many turns in the evil spinning washing thingy!




