

The Hydroponics Experiment: Part 1



Dear allotment gardeners and big city farmers, we want to tell you about our indoor garden!

It all started with the Christmas gift from Human 2 to Human 1 and us.

We chose tomatoes (yellow & red), cucumber, pea and lettuce, and have shown the development of the plants in the first week in pictures.



Hydroponics is a type of horticulture and a subset of hydroponic cultivation in which plants, usually crops, are grown without soil using mineral nutrient solutions in an aqueous solvent.

Our hydroponic system has room for 12 plants, has a pump that circulates the nutrient solution and a timer that provides 16 hours of light and then simulates night for 8 hours.





Already after a week, we could report success! All the seeds had sprouted and the plants were thriving. We fertilised 1x/week with the special fertiliser for hydroponic systems.



After 3 weeks we had a small forest of tomatoes. And the lettuce was ready to be harvested.
